**V. New Business**

**1. President's Council Meeting**

Cindy attended the President's Council Meeting. The Vice President's and Provost were present and three had professional development as part of their strategic plans. Mary Ann Swain focused on training for Deans and Directors. She also discussed the division of SEHD into two schools. Vice President Summers talked about cross training and having current employees keep a log of exactly what they do to ensure that their work can continue rather seamlessly upon leaving. Sometimes when people are in a position for many years and either leave or retire, it is hard for someone else to pick up where they left off. Vice President VanVoorst would like to create programs to identify people who are willing and able to move up within the University. Vice President Sonnenfeld talked about the Innovative Technologies Complex (ITC) and the different phases of development/who will be housed there. President DeFleur announced that the MBA program has opened a branch in NYC. Fifty students will begin in January. Fifty students from Tulane and the University of New Orleans have been welcomed here at BU—more than any other SUNY campus. She has been receiving many complementary letters from the parents of these students. She also mentioned that thirty six new faculty are expected to be hired this year.

**2. Speakers**

President DeFleur will speak to the PEC on March 2<sup>nd</sup>, 2006. Work needs to begin on scheduling other speakers. **Ideas:** Snow removal speaker in November or December, EH&S to provide an update on asbestos/mold, Space Issues, someone from the Computer Center or Sensitive Data Committee to discuss Security Issues, Telecommunications—new programs and updates. Another idea mentioned is the possibility of holding one of our meetings over at the ITC and taking a tour while we are over there.

### **3. PEC Awareness Task Force**

Bob Mess discussed the campus perception that PEC is a part of UUP. We need to inform members of the difference between the two and at the same time raise awareness regarding PEC. Members of the committee include B. Mess, D. Guido, M. Nostrom, D. Stone, and K. Finnie. This group is looking for members and ideas. The first meeting will be held in the next week or 2.
